progressive, debilitating and deadly disease that destroys brain cells and affects areas of the brain involved in memory, cognition, judgment, language and behavior. As the baby boomer population ages, the incidence of Alzheimer's disease is expected to increase dramatically. Currently available therapies for Alzheimer's treat the symptoms with modest effect, and there is no evidence that these medications alter the course of the underlying disease process.

About Dimebon

Dimebon is an investigational therapy in clinical development for the treatment of Alzheimer's disease. It targets Alzheimer's disease differently than currently available therapies. Mitochondria (a cell's primary source of energy) are the target of Dimebon's mechanism of action.
